Issues

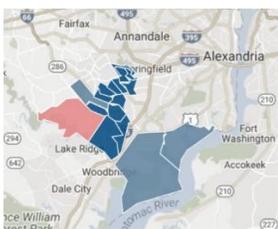

VA HD-42: Better Know the District

Geography & Environment

District 42 is a part of the Washington Metro Area located in Southeastern Fairfax County. It is bordered on the west, south and southeast by the Potomac River. The northeastern section is nearly split by Districts 39, 43 and 44. With the 2011 redistricting, parts of Newington Forrest and Lorton, 2 of the 3 areas with the lowest white population and lowest educational attainment levels, were split off to become parts of Districts 39 and 43.

Citizensry

The population of District 42 is both older and younger than Virginia with less people age 18-29 and more 0-17 and 45-61. Of the 27,280 households, 67% are married, and, of those, 84% have children under 18. The district is more diverse than the state with 62% white vs 64% for Virginia. It has a larger Hispanic (10% vs 8%) and Asian population (14% vs 6%) than the state. The black population (9%) is below Virginia (19%) except in Lorton (30%), Laurel Hill (23%) and Fort Belvoir (20%). The ancestry of the Asian population is primarily Korean (21%), Vietnamese (19%) and Pakistani (17%) followed by Indian 15%, Filipino 13%, Chinese 8% and Japanese 2.6%. More than 50% of the population of Lorton and Laurel Hill are minorities. Lorton is the most ethnically diverse (72% minority) and has the largest younger adult population age 18-39. Of the 46.4% who affiliate with a religion, Catholics are by far the largest group (18%), and only 6.4% are another Christian faith, 4.8% affiliate with Islam, 1.6% are an eastern faith, and 5% are Jewish. There are 3 mosques, 2 synagogues and 2 temples within the district or close by.

Education

The educational level of the residents aged 25 or older is high: 66% have degrees higher than high school level and, of those, 30% have above a Bachelor's degree. Thirty percent have a high school diploma, and only 4.3% have no high school diploma. The district is served by the Fairfax County Public School system, to which the county government allocates 52.2% of its fiscal budget.

Economy

The District has a strong economy, with many of the residents holding high paying jobs in professional, government and healthcare industries. Fort Belvoir is the county's single largest location of federal employment. The district median income of \$128,700 is more than double that of Virginia and 5th highest of all 100 districts. The median income of the bottom 20% is \$65,100. Non-Hispanic white households have the highest median income at \$138,500 followed by Asians with \$119,100. Median incomes for blacks and Hispanics are \$101,000 and \$84,000, respectively. Among the working age population of 62,000, 5% are in the Armed Forces, 65% are employed, 3% are unemployed and 27% are not in the labor force. There are only 470 households on food stamps.

Health Status

The population of District 42 is generally healthy with good access to healthcare. Only 700 would gain healthcare coverage by closing the Medicaid gap. In Fairfax County, the number of uninsured people decreased from 8% in 2013 to only 3% in 2016 demonstrating the importance of the ACA to the region.
